Aneska França: Bridging Cultures Through Dance – From Brazil to Los Angeles

Los Angeles, CA — Aneska França is a Brazilian dancer, choreographer, educator, and cultural producer whose vibrant career unites the precision of science with the soul of art. With over two decades of experience in both performance and education, she is a recognized authority in Brazilian Zouk, and a passionate advocate for the preservation and reinvention of Brazilian folkloric dances on international stages.

Her passion for movement began in childhood, when she devoted herself to ballet, jazz, and Brazilian popular dances. As a teenager, she was a member of the Criart Cia de Dança, an important stepping stone in her artistic formation.

Aneska's professional journey started in Recife, Brazil, where she received her first formal training in partner dancing at the Centro de Dança Jaime Arôxa — a landmark institution for Brazilian ballroom dance. At age 17, she earned her professional certification as a dancer and choreographer from SATED Pernambuco. She later founded Studio Aneska, a creative hub for dance education and cultural production in her home state.

Academically, she holds a degree in Biological Sciences, a specialization in Human Morphology from the Federal University of Pernambuco (UFPE), and a postgraduate degree in Dance and Body Awareness from Universidade Gama Filho in São Paulo. Her dual background in science and art informs a teaching and choreographic approach that integrates anatomical precision, expressiveness, and holistic movement understanding.

She is also a classically trained ballerina with formation in the Vaganova method, widely recognized for its strength, discipline, and artistry. Her choreography unites the elegance of ballet with the theatricality and rhythmic diversity of Brazilian dance.

Aneska has served as a Cultural Delegate for the State of Pernambuco and was a board member of ASPEDS (Associação Pernambucana de Dança de Salão), working on initiatives that empowered artists and expanded access to cultural programs.

She has also competed in and won awards at national and international Brazilian Zouk competitions, further refining her skills as a performer and mentor for aspiring professionals.

Now based in Los Angeles, Aneska is the founder and artistic director of the Aneska Dance Company, where she develops multicultural performances blending Brazilian identity, ballet foundations, and modern creative expression. She teaches in the Los Angeles Unified School District through the Conga Kids program, using dance as a tool for connection, learning, and empowerment.

Her mission is to inspire dancers to explore their identities through movement — building cultural bridges and transforming lives through the universal language of dance.



Aneska Dance Company

Founded in 2014 in Recife, Brazil, Aneska Dance Company is dedicated to promoting dance and creating creative and productive opportunities for dancers and choreographers. Under the leadership of dancer, teacher, choreographer, and specialist in dance and body awareness Aneska França, the company has distinguished itself by integrating Brazil's rich cultural heritage with contemporary innovation.

Since 2022, Aneska Dance Company has expanded its activities to Los Angeles, USA, broadening its artistic impact and bringing the uniqueness of Brazilian culture to new audiences. This international growth reflects the company's commitment to artistic excellence and global innovation.

Throughout its journey, the company has created numerous performances and choreographic showcases that blend a wide range of dance styles—including ballroom, ballet, jazz, contemporary dance, belly dance, and hip hop—always presented with a creative and original vision.

In addition to its artistic productions, Aneska offers regular dance classes, develops custom choreography for weddings and special events, and directs performance teams for dancers seeking to deepen their technique and stage experience. She also provides body preparation for actors and creates choreography for films, supporting performers with movement direction and physical storytelling.

Throughout her career, she has developed a unique artistic voice that integrates ballet, contemporary dance, ballroom influences, and Brazilian dance forms. Aneska is also the founder and director of Aneska Dance Company, known for its innovative productions and for promoting Brazilian culture through dance in both Brazil and the United States.

Clinton Lacerda, a highly respected dancer and instructor from Brazil, brings over twenty years of experience in Brazilian Zouk and Samba de Gafieira. His career has taken him across Brazil, Europe, the Middle East, and the United States, where he is celebrated for his exceptional technique, partner connection, and musical interpretation. Clinton's artistic approach is rooted in clarity, precision, and the expressive possibilities of partner dance.

Together, Aneska and Clinton merge their complementary strengths—Aneska's embodied artistry and contemporary sensibility with Clinton's technical refinement and rhythmic intuition. Their performances spotlight the versatility of Brazilian Zouk as both a social dance and a theatrical art form, captivating audiences with elegance, flow, and authentic cultural expression. The malandro—a charming, quick-witted rogue—has long been a central archetype in Brazilian culture, symbolizing resistance, creativity, and survival with style. Rooted in Brazil's colonial era, he emerged as someone who navigated inequality with improvisation, charisma, and bohemian flair. In Ópera do Malandro, Chico Buarque's 1978 musical inspired by Brecht and set in 1940s Rio during the Vargas era, this figure becomes a theatrical lens into the tensions between marginality, authority, and desire.

"A Volta do Malandro" brings that spirit to life: a celebration of resilience, seduction, and the refusal to lose grace when life gets hard. Through the malandro's swagger and lightness—dancing through hardship as if through an endless carnival—the piece reflects the contradictions of Brazilian identity itself.

Raiz Brazil has performed also in different Events in California like Private Parties, Restaurants, Casinos, Clubs, Bolivian Carnival Crucena, Brazilian Carnival Ball in San Diego with Brazilian Productions, Santa Barbara Brazilian Carnival produced by Soul Brasil Magazine, Carnival en Ensenada/Mexico, a Circus Show for 6 weeks in Northern California called "Circo Brazil Show". In Casinos and Hotels in Las Vegas and Reno like the "Four Seasons in Las Vegas", "Atlantis Casino in Reno", "Grand Sierra Resort & Casino in Reno" and countless Events and Cotporate parties in Los Angeles.

3rd Street Dance Studio



Currently, Marissa is a dance instructor at The School of Arts and Enterprise in Pomona, CA, while also pursuing a CTE certification in Arts, Media, and Entertainment. She directs Marés Dance Company, where she specializes in Brazilian Zouk fusion choreographies for adult dancers. Beyond her professional life, she enjoys practicing yoga, meditating, and spending time with her fur babies, Frida and Kahlo.




